Letter from the President

Congressman Mike Quigley attended our last meeting. He provided an "insider's" look at current activities at the Capitol and fielded questions from members afterwards. He discussed the continuing investigations of Russian interference in our elections, and efforts to safeguard election and polling place procedures from outside infiltration and manipulation. He noted HR 1 which was introduced to install ethical and operating checks on candidates and the election process to help safeguard the integrity of our democratic process and the people who run for, and ultimately hold, public offices at the federal, state and local levels.



The Congressman's introductory comments segued into presentations by the two runoff candidates for the 39th Ward: Samantha Nugent and Robert Murphy. Each was provided approximately ten minutes to outline their positions and platforms, followed by short questioning. MCA participated in structuring the initial 39th Ward Candidate Forum with Hollywood North Park Community Association, North Mayfair Improvement Association, Old Irving Park Association, and several other neighboring civic organizations, and in setting up the second Forum for the run-off candidates.

First Nations Community Garden

Members of the Chi-Nation Youth Council seemed eager to get working with the land at the The First Nations Garden, located at the south-east corner of the intersection of N Pulaski Ave and W Wilson Ave, when I stopped by for a brief visit on the afternoon of Sunday, March 24. According to Janie Pochel, a member of the Youth Council who was there, fellow members were out digging up rocks and whatever other work they could get away with doing on one of the first days that the ground was thawed enough for such activity. This work went on outside while, inside the covered tipi in the Garden, other Youth Council members, their family, and friends, processed maple sap over a fire.

The Garden, together with the Triangle Park at the corner of Kasson and Wilson Avenue, makes two new green spaces in the area this year! The American Indian Center states on their website that the mission of The Garden is "to provide a healing space for the Intertribal Native Community of Chicago, to promote public knowledge and appreciation of Chicago's Indigenous landscape, native plants, gardens and the environment."
