Community Safety

Alderman Samantha Nugent attended the October MCA meeting along with community members, and we once again discussed the continued increase in violence in the community over the past number of months. While there isn't a lot of information available about the specific circumstances that have led to the increase, there are many likely contributing factors during these difficult times. While gang activity can explain some of these incidents, it's less clear that all of the shootings and other violence in the area have been gang-related. It was suggested that it may be due in part to a reallocation of public safety resources to cover the marches and protests that were happening downtown and around the city since around Memorial Day. It was also proposed that a disruption in police engagement with youth due to school shutdowns may have closed down communication channels that have helped in the past to mitigate problems before they turn to violence.

We can all help to reduce the violence. Alderman Nugent said that she pushed last year and got more police officers in the 17th district, and she plans to keep the pressure up so that we continue to have the resources we need. Community members can help by calling 911 when gunshots are heard, even if it's not clear where they came from, because the calls help police get an idea of the

location, and resources are allocated based in large part on 911 call volume in an area. The Alderman proposed calling 311 when necessary to keep things in the neighborhood in good repair, which can also help deter crime. Another attendee suggested that people be out and visible in the neighborhood while being aware of your surroundings, and letting others nearby know that you see them; if witnesses are around, a crime is less-likely to occur. If you see something suspicious, call it in to 911 as soon as you can.

Another great way to help is to stay informed and share your concerns and ideas by attending your Civic Association meetings. Voicing our concerns together helps to ensure that they're heard and addressed. We hope to see you at this month's meeting!

Updates from the Alderman

Here are some selections from the Alderman's recent newsletters and communications.

COVID-19 Second Wave

Since Friday, October 30, restaurants and bars have been required to stop indoor dining services per an order from Governor Pritzker. Outdoor dining must close by 11pm., and reservations will be required for each party.

Mitigations for Chicago

Bars:

- No indoor service.
- All outside bar service closes at 11:00pm.
- All bar patrons should be seated at tables outside.
- There will be no ordering, seating, or congregating at the bar.
- The tables should be 6 feet apart.
- No standing or congregating indoors or outdoors while waiting for a table or exiting.
- No dancing or standing indoors.
- Reservations are required for each party.
- No seating of multiple parties at one table.

Restaurants:

- No indoor dining or bar service.
- All outdoor dining closes at 11:00pm.
- Outside dining tables should be 6 feet apart.
- No standing or congregating indoors or outdoors while waiting for a table or exiting.
- Reservations are required for each party.
- No seating of multiple parties at one table.

Meetings, Social Events, Gatherings:

- Limit to less than 25 guests or 25 percent of overall room capacity
- No party buses.

Autumn Leaf Cleanup Reminder

Autumn is here and the leaves are falling. I want to remind neighbors to please rake the leaves from the parkways and bag them properly.

Do not rake leaves into the street or the street sweepers will jam and/or break sweeper parts and cause massive delays in any cleanup of streets. The City does not vacuum leaves from the street. Please maintain your parkway and encourage your neighbors to do so as well. Please report any companies blowing leaves into the street to 311 or my office.

You can dispose of your yard waste by putting the bag next to your blue cart to be picked up with the recycling. You can also help prevent street flooding by cleaning the leaves off the top of the sewer grates.

Debris clogs sewers and leads to flooding of streets. Simply throwing out debris in the trash goes a long way toward keeping your neighborhood clean.
