Let us know what you think about these improvements.

Congressman Quigley wants to know about your outdoor summer events

The Congressman was at the April membership meeting, and said he would really like to know about and try to attend as many outdoors events, festivals, block parties, etc. this summer. If you are organizing a local event, let the Congressman's office know by calling 773-267-5926, or via Quigley.House.Gov.

Attendees asked about postal office issues they've noticed or experienced, such as being charged to return incorrectly-delivered packages. The Congressman said he was aware that such issues were ongoing. In February, he voted to pass the Postal Service Reform Act, and said that he hopes that it will begin to help with such issues. According to the Congressman's press release on the vote, the Act would "make needed financial and operational reforms" and, among other things, "enhance transparency and accountability of USPS service performance." In the meantime, if you experience any such issues with your postal service, Congressman Quigley asks that you let Dana Fritz at his office know. Updates from the Alderman

Alderman Nugent announced the new 17th District Police Commander, Michelene Alexa, replacing Ronald Pontecore, Jr., who was named deputy chief. The Alderman mentioned that Commander Alexa was previously the 17th District tactical lieutenant.

An attendee asked about the status of the bump-out gardens around the neighborhood, which are being repaired with funds from the latest round of Participatory Budgeting. This work is progressing, Erika Wozniak, Alderman Nugent's chief of staff, said at the April membership meeting that they were working with contractors to make the concrete repairs, and were looking for steel workers to repair the fencing.

Potholes are still an issue

The ongoing pothole issue in the neighborhood was brought up again at the May membership meeting. An attendee indicated that Kildare Avenue specifically needs repairs where it meets up with Lawrence Avenue. Despite the potholes being a known issue for quite some time, it was mentioned that the issue persists across the neighborhood. Erika Wozniak from the Alderman's office said they had 342 requests to fill potholes at the time, and are doing what they can. Ms. Wozniak said that finances to do the repairs are limited. The ward gets \$1.3 million each year for such work, and \$500,000 of that goes to Participatory Budgeting, with the rest being spent on roads -- including potholes -- and other needed construction. She said that they are getting creative to find other sources of funding, raising the issue with county commissioners, state representatives and senators.

Be aware:

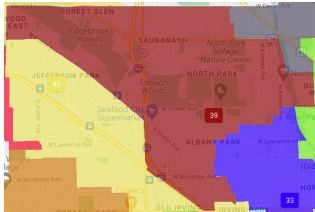
- All dogs must be on a leash and all cats must be in a carrier.

Updates from the Alderman

Samantha Nugent, 39th Ward

Here are some selections from the Alderman's recent newsletters and communications.



New Ward Map Approved

On Monday, May 16th, City Council voted 43-7 to approve a new ward map for the next 10 years. I voted yes to the proposal that largely keeps the 39th Ward boundaries the same. The new ward map can be seen at

Changes to the 39th include adding a section of Budlong Woods from Bryn Mawr to Foster and the river to the west side of California. Our neighbors on the 6200 block of Ridgeway and the west side of the 6300 block of Ridgeway will be part of the new 50th Ward. I am sad to see these blocks leave the 39th Ward.

Bringing the aldermen together to create and agree on a new map is a nearly impossible task. I applaud Chairwoman Michelle Harris for her leadership and thank my colleagues for working together to pass this map. The new ward map will take effect with the 2023 municipal elections.

Construction Season

Construction season is now in full swing. We ask for your patience as crews work in the parkways and streets. You can see the project type, scope, work dates, and permits that have been pulled.

Bumpout Gardens on Lawrence Ave

Progress is underway for the Lawrence Avenue Revitalization, a 2022 Participatory Budget winning project. Bumpout Gardens at Lawrence and Kildare are getting new concrete and rod-iron fencing.
